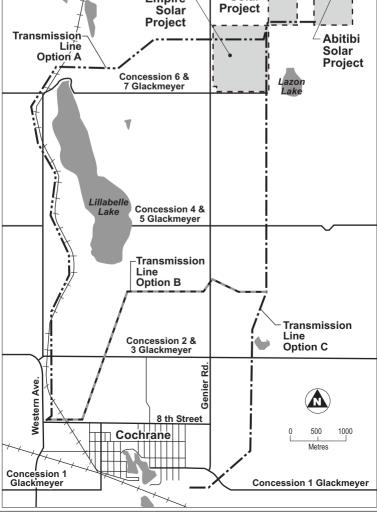

Students see 'ghosts'

Does every action have a conse-quence? How about drinking or texting while driving?

Being in a police car, ambulance or a hearse may be a high-schooler's worst nightmore - in this case it was an educational experience only, as all three of these vehicles were positioned in front of Cochrane High School's main entrance for all to see on May 25, as part of a 'Day of Consequences'

The occasion was to bring awareness to the consequences of drinking and/or texting while driving a vehicle. Throughout the day, over a dozen students left their classrooms every 22 minutes and came back dressed in black with white face paint on their faces to represent how often someone dies due to drinking and/or texting while driv-

Students attended an assembly where a graphic awareness video was presented and personal speeches were given by several people including Jossette Morin of the Poscupine Health Unit, local OPP officer Jack Hawryluk and Irvine &Irvine funeral director and owner Jamie Rheault.

Anne Tremblay, Cochrane High's French teacher and Student Success teacher explained that the PHU had called her about putting on the event. Ms Tremblay said she realizes the importance of the message and gladly cooperated to arrange the event.

Darion Dumoulin, one of several students who participated as a 'ghost', was approached by his teacher with the idea and he was more than willing to take part in due to personal reasons. These "ghosts" represented someone who had died to due distracted or impaired driving.

'I know a couple people whose family members have died from that," he said intently. "The statistic is that every 22 minutes a person dies from drunk driving, so every 22 minutes there would be a car crash on the announcements, we would come down here and get our faces painted, be given a t-shirt and go back to class and we weren't allowed to talk because we were 'shosts'."

After the assembly students were welOfficer Jack Hawryluk was personally affected by drinking and driving because a close friend was involved in a related tragedy.

"In the Tunis-Iroquois Falls area about six or seven years ago or so, a tmesport and pickup truck collided head-on," he said with visible emotion. We have reason to believe that the pickup track driver was contemplating suicide and actually meant to strike the transport truck deliberately to end his life."

Const. Hawryluk mentioned that he believes education is key for the message to get across and that could prevent kids from making bad choices along on the road.

We can talk until we're blue in the face but when we bring our personal and professional experience as well with a graphic video, it hits home a little more," he said.

Paramedics Victor Wright and Bryan Kydd were on site answering questions students had. They both expressed their concerns about drinking

"Every day there's always somebody drinking and driving, or on their cell phones and driving," Mr. Wright said. "T ve been doing this for 30-something years and I haven't seen a change yet.

Irvine & Irvine Owner and Funeral Director Jamie Rhesult said that when someone dies there is no best scenario and youg adults need to learn this message

Jossette Morin of the Porcupine Health Unit was observing the reactions students gave during the assembly and afterwards.

Principal of Cochrane High, Kristiayne Berthiaume, found the event to be successful and evident in it's impor-

"I think that it's great for the kids to experience this and see it firsthand.

Sometimes the students may think that they are invincible to this and it won't happen to them, this helps them get a touch of reality," she said. "I would like this to affect all of our students but if it could affect just one student, hopefully after seeing and remembering this, they'll decide not to take that

Common words: 'The' has staying power

he most commonly used word in the English language has been "the" since at least 1520, according to a new study that analyzed 5.2 million books published over five centuries.

But while many of the most popular words have remained the same over the centuries — the top five has almost always included "the," "of," "and," "to" and "in" — everything else has changed dramutically, becoming a lot less religious and a lot more American.

In the 1500s, words like "haptized," "God," "Christ" and "hymno" littered the top 100 lists. By the late 1700s, those Christian words were mostly absent.

According to the study by Matjaz Perc at the University of Maribor in Slovenia, the top 100 four-word planaes between 1520 and 1575 included things like "of the Pope and," "the Word of God," "Pope and his followers," "haptized in the name," "the name of Jesus" and "the pardon of sins," among others.

By contrast, in 2008 the top five four-word planses were "at the same time," "the end of the," "in the United States," "at the end of" and "of the United States."

In his study, published in the Royal Society Interface, Perc credits some of these changes to the way publishing has evolved. Once, only certain institutions, many of them Church-affiliated, could publish literature. Now anyone can.

While it may seem as though English is constantly changing, especially with new technology and Internet-based words enter-ing the versacular, Perc said English has actually reached a mature

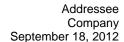




